### Moving Forward...

### Investing in growth and new technology for the future.

Chief financial officer, Richard Irons looks ahead as we step up to deliver our growth plans for the company.

Trading conditions remained challenging throughout most of the 2023-24 financial year, due to continuing high interest rates and the uncertainty in the run up to the general election. During this period, it was necessary to slow down the rate of production, whilst maintaining our focus on quality and customer service.

It is pleasing to report that recent months have shown a distinct and consistent improvement in both visitor numbers across our sites and reservations, with the green shoots of growth beginning to appear. This has been supported by an improving economic outlook with inflation rates subsiding and interest rates expected to start to reduce, together with ambitious housebuilding plans announced by the new Labour government.

We now have the confidence to move forwards, reinvesting in the business to ensure we can meet our future growth plans. This includes exciting investment plans around people, land, plant, equipment and technology.

Our 2024-25 targets are based on increasing sales and build rates across our regions, and we will be increasing resources where necessary to achieve this, as well as investing in new plant & machinery to improve build efficiency.

This financial year has started well with the announcement of a new site in the West Midlands which is excellent news. We now have two developments, Warwick and Coventry, poised to commence during 2024-25 and a strong future pipeline of sites giving the West Midlands a great basis for growth.

Continued investment in land is, of course, a key element of the business plan and we will be adding more sites to the development programme throughout the coming year.

Another area of focus is the New Homes Quality Board (NHQB) with the requirement to adopt and adapt principles and practices which affect many day-to-day aspects of the business. Our target is to be 'NHQB live' by 1 June 2025.

I'm pleased to say that over the last 12 months a great deal of progress has been made in preparation for the NHQB launch.

Over the summer of 2025 and through the autumn we will be starting to trial and implement a whole host of new processes and procedures including the following:

- Introduction of a new 'end to end' Customer Journey to ensure consistent customer experience across all sites.
- Launch of new customer information and home demonstration videos.
- A new William Davis 'intranet' containing new standard forms, new procedures, and a new filing structure for sharing site and plot documents, which will replace the existing Hub.
- Roll out of the 'William Davis Homes App' providing the platform for future site reporting (eg H&S forms, insurance forms, Part L), record plot snagging data, enable employee 'sign in sign out' along with a growing list of other functions planned for the future.
- System design is in process for a new customer portal with launch expected in 2025.

The introduction of these technologies is only possible following the recent investments in IT that continue to migrate our

data and systems to the 'Cloud' thereby improving accessibility and security.

Finally, one of our biggest areas of investment for growth is people.

This issue of Insite features a number of important new appointments, all aimed at strengthening and building our already excellent team. Included is the senior appointment of Scott Rush as head of finance. This supports our business plan and will enable me to focus more on our longer-term strategic priorities.

Looking ahead, it's going to be a busy year, delivering the targets set and making sure the improvements made to systems and processes are running as they should be, whilst delivering the objectives planned. It's certainly an exciting time to be at William Davis as we move into a new growth and modernisation phase with a confident and positive outlook!

'In parallel with adopting the NHQC we have taken the opportunity to move some of our sales and customer service materials onto a digital platform.

Our customer services and production departments have worked together to produce a series of customer information videos. Accessible via email or smart phone, these are designed to guide customers through various aspects of their new home – including adjusting the heating system and setting the alarm – whilst also providing information on how to operate and enjoy all the excellent features of their new William Davis home

'We are also in the process of developing a customer portal, which will allow customers access to all the information relevant to the sales process prior to completion; to quickly access information about their new home once they have moved in and to be able to communicate with customer services all in one place.

'Our HBF 5 Star record is fantastic, and our new initiatives will not only improve how we communicate with and support our customers but will also help us maintain these standards of excellence.

'I also feel that it is really important we harness the huge amount of knowledge and experience that exists within the business to continue to drive improvements.

## Sites on the Horizon!

While our site and sales teams are at the frontline of what we do – building and selling our quality new homes – the Land & Planning teams are busy in the background, seeking out land opportunities, acquiring new sites, while keeping the planning process moving forward.

But it can be a lengthy and complicated procedure, and the journey from 'land acquired' to 'planning permission granted' can often be drawn out and difficult.

Looking to glean an understanding of how the whole process works, Insite caught up with group land director, Sarah Whetton, planning manager Tom Dillarstone and the rest of the land & planning team.

#### Sarah explained:

'Land & Planning is a main area of investment for the business. Building land is expensive to buy, and while we all appreciate that there is only a limited supply, there are other limitations to be taken into consideration too.

'For example, we operate in the

East and West Midlands which, although a densely populated area – meaning there's a built-in requirement for housing – planning constraints and other legal requirements can be complex and restrictive, and they can vary greatly from one local authority to another, meaning the process, once we purchase the land is far from straightforward.

'As a company however, we are very fortunate to have a solid land bank – meaning land 'in stock' – already purchased for future

development, and we are always looking for further acquisition opportunities to add to this.

'Yet while buying land can be tricky, getting on site can also be a difficult and convoluted process, requiring experience, expertise and tenacity.

'For instance, Garendon Park, our newest development was originally optioned for housing in the 1990s. Planning was applied for in 2014 and it went to the planning committee in 2015, with a decision not reached until July 2018, and here we are, six years later finally on site. It just proves how resilient we are as company.

'In contrast, our scheme at Westwood Heath, Coventry is what is known as an 'instant' site. Having been purchased in June 2024, we are hoping to achieve planning permission by October 2024, with a potential 'start on site' date around December 2024 /January 2025.

This purchase has given us a much quicker turnaround for the whole process, and being

an excellent site – adjacent to another quality new homes builder – it's given our fledgling West Midlands division a firm foothold in the area and will prove a wise investment long-term.

'However, it's important to emphasise that the main reason we persevere with seeking planning for strategic land, is that this should provide the business with a far better profit margin, and is therefore, preferable to having to go the 'instant' market route and purchase sites at a reduced margin.

'Which is why – as we go to press – we have a total of 22 live applications on strategic land being guided through the planning process, ensuring we will have more 'sites on the horizon' in the not-too-distant future.

'We have a great team here, in both land & planning, and all fully appreciate how important our role is for the future success of the company. It's a fascinating area of the business, and one I feel very proud to be part of!"

The process of ensuring everything has been completed, with elements like roads, sewers, pathways etc., handed over to the relevant local authority can take time and perseverance too. There still a lot of unseen work being undertaken after our last customer has moved in on a new site.' Paul Watkins, head of technical.

### The Planning Process

#### Step 1

#### Site Acquisition

Once we acquire a site, we sign an 'option agreement' with the owner and one of the first things we undertake is a financial viability assessment. Providing that looks favourable, we then prepare a series of technical reports about the site, including elements such as:

- Ecolog
- Highway
- Draina
- Plus any special requirements the site might have.


These reports are all brought together to inform the masterplan for the site; namely the scheme we are putting forward for planning permission.

#### Step 2

### Planning application into the Council

Next, we agree, having taken extensive consultation, to put a planning application into the council. Timing can be crucial here, and we add a lot more detail for this element of the process, conducting further investigations, flagging up issues, adding house types and landscaping, designing roads and sewers etc,.

Once this has been submitted, it should take 13 weeks, yet it can take over two years. If permission is refused, we make a judgement whether to appeal or not. This means more work and more time, but it's all part of the process.

### Step 3 Planning Approved

Once planning is approved, our next task is to agree the Section 106. This covers benefits to the community eg education, social housing, sports, recreational and other facilities.

Then we start working on detailed drawings, together with the construction management plan – which will include managing dust, noise, routes for deliveries, location of the compound, protection of trees and hedges etc..

### Step 4 Spade in the Ground
